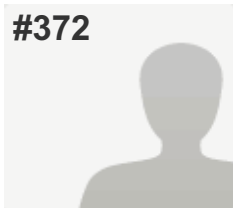

It was felt the session was extremely valuable in gaining a greater understanding of the role people can play in helping the government meet its ambitions. However, a point was raised around the methodology. It was felt it is potentially skewed for politicians to hide behind and to avoid issues rather than address those issues within disadvantaged communities. It was suggested that rather than a whole societal approach, groups and communities should be treated separately.

It is important that the links between the existing strategies and delivery plans are considered. There's a certain amount of confusion of where existing strategies sit and their status in going forward as a guide to the third sector being a respected and valued partner to government and helping them achieve these outcomes.

An issue which was raised was the absence of any measurements or indicators around domestic violence. It was strongly felt that this should be included in a number of the outcomes and their delivery plans.
