A big 'THANK YOU' National Lottery Community Fund

FSP has received funding from the National Lottery Community Fund to continue the particularly important work in our ROMA Hub at our offices on University Street. Our hub includes a drop-





in advice centre for ROMA families and individuals, helping them in many ways with often complex issues.

Specifically, we run clinics on Wednesdays and Thursdays for families and individuals struggling to navigate the welfare system in conjunction with Advice NI and give advice for settlement within NI. There is also an outreach worker and

support worker who run English Classes, ROMA women's group and other events for the community.

This is a city-wide service working for all the Roma, so FSP are happy to help where we can. 
Community inclusion

Community and Voluntary Sector Budget Cuts Updates

On the 3rd of May, FSP attended a meeting at NICVA with the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland, Chris Heaton Harris to discuss the budget cuts on the community and voluntary sector and impact this will have on lives of its residents. A Community Day of Action was called for 25th May which FSP attended with sector colleagues.

In June FSP also attended a meeting hosted by NICVA with Head of NI Civil Service Jayne Brady and Deputy permanent

secretary Moira Doherty to keep sustained pressure around this vital issue.

Health update- working collaboratively to deliver health and well being

South Belfast Social Supermarket

Forward South Partnership facilitated a Social Supermarket Programme in communities across South Belfast supporting 913 individuals in total with 640 meals being delivered across 16 community meals and 273 individuals being supported through food vouchers.



South Belfast Cost of Living Response

Forward South Partnership supported several initiatives in the wider South Belfast Community by funding 246 Winter Self Care Packs to promote positive physical, mental, and emotional wellbeing. Supporting Belvoir Community Hub, Ballynafeigh Community Development Association, Sure Start and Northern Ireland Muslim Association to deliver 275 Cook It Food Parcels and Community Meals.

We have also supported the Ballynafeigh Cosy Hubs to provide refreshments, health, and wellbeing activities to support their warm space initiative.



FSP is about coordinating and signposting people/groups to help navigate and access services that will support them. Our Strategic Health Officer developed the South Belfast Cost of Living plan which details the wider South Belfast Support that is available to the community during the cost-of-living crisis. Keeping South Belfast Warm

Forward South Partnership secured funding to support individuals over the age of 55 during the cost-of-living crisis. So far in the project FSP has supported 42 individuals with food, gas, and electric vouchers. We have also facilitated 3 community meals with 50 individuals attending to receive a hot meal and receive supportive information from Consumer Council NI, British Red Cross, Advice NI and more.

Belfast City Council Move More Eat Well to Feel Better

South Belfast held a Voting Event in April in Holy Rosary Parish Centre with over 200 votes counted on the night! Five groups will receive funding to support their project delivery. 
